Thanks to everyone who participated and a special thank you to Suzanne Underwood for planning and arrangements.






- A local manufacturer continues to show strong interest in 1400 Old Stage Rd. Staff is coordinating with GADC on additional incentives. Duke Energy has previously provided \$50,000 in Utility Tax Credit funds to assist with infrastructure improvements to the site.








New playground equipment installed at Sunset Park







SMOKE DETECTOR BLITZ — AMERICAN RED CROSS AND SC FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION

The Mauldin Fire Department is participating in an important fire prevention program providing new smoke alarms for single family homes. We are initially targeting low income areas to start the program. The smoke alarms provided through this grant program are equipped with a 10-year battery. Firefighters are installing the alarms to ensure they are installed in the correct location.

We installed 50 smoke alarms and did safety checks on 35 homes around the city. These homes had 23 smoke alarms with only 13 working, but out of date.


The total smoke alarms installed to date is 404 in 372 homes.

In September 2016, 463 new cases were filed with Municipal Court.


Pending Cases as of September 30
