



Veterans Memorial and Peace Garden

Temporary overflow parking— reinforced turf area reserved for parking for special events. (Note that there is an abundance of public and private parking in close proximity to the Center. Sharing those facilities would reduce infrastructure costs as well as avoid excess paving.)

Potential addition to the Recreation Center

Outdoor performance/ entertainment area— a stage nestled into a grove on the north side of the building where music and theatre events could be held. Picnic area could be integrated into the grove as well.

Multi-purpose playfield could be designed for many types of field events from pick-up frisbee, to youth soccer, to festivals. The terraces on the west side of the building would provide a great space to view events on the field. This area could be designed to also handle extreme storm events.

Storm water pond to be reconfigured to provide an amenity for the park while providing effective infiltration of excess surface water drainage.

Entry to Veterans Memorial Walk will feature flags that prominently announce the entry to the memorial

New parking should be added with pervious paving and plenty of shade.

Cultural Center Plaza—celebrates entrance to the Center and provides an opportunity to host outdoor special events.

Pedestrian crossing of railroad to connect City Hall and the Cultural Center complex.

Main entry

Garden Club Meditation Gardens— could also provide outdoor space for education, children's or demonstration gardens.

Historic log cabin provides opportunities for visitors' bureau, ticket sales, etc.

Veterans Memorial Walk—begins at the main entrance to the complex on East Butler Road and winds throughout the park culminating in a meditation/peace garden in the northeast corner of the complex. Along the pathway would be specific areas commemorating historical events connected with those who have served.
